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Communicable Disease Surveillance Case Definitions A surveillance case definition is a set of uniform criteria used to define a disease for public health surveillance. Surveillance case definitions enable public health officials to classify and count cases consistently across reporting jurisdictions. Surveillance case definitions are not intended to be used by healthcare providers for making a clinical diagnosis or determining how to meet an individual patient's health needs. Confirmed case: A case that is classified as confirmed for reporting purposes. Case Definitions for Communicable Morbidities Case classification Probable: a clinically compatible case caused by laboratory-confirmed culture of *S. pneumoniae* identified as "nonsusceptible" (i.e., an oxacillin zone size of less than 20 mm) when oxacillin screening is the only method of antimicrobial susceptibility testing performed. A few diseases (i.e. HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis, West Nile virus, Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease, influenza and acute flaccid paralysis) are reported directly to PHAC disease-specific programs, due to the complexity of the disease or its surveillance system.
