Question 1.1: What is your preliminary diagnosis? The combination of fever, tachypnea, and tachycardia suggests systemic inflammatory response syndrome (SIRS), which is

usually defined as the presence of two or more of the following: (1) fever ($> 38^{\circ}\text{C}$) or hypothermia ($< 36^{\circ}\text{C}$); (2) tachypnea ($\text{R} > 24/\text{min}$); tachycardia ($\text{P} > 90/\text{min}$); and (4) leukocytosis ($> 12,000/(\text{l})$), leukopenia ($< 4,000/(\text{l})$), or $>10\%$ bands.
